

















Grove of The Flight

This "Grove of The Flight" is dedicated to all people on the run. It consists of 7 rows of $\overline{7}$ trees. The number 7 is a powerfully lucky number in almost all cultures and religions. May this good fortune be granted to all who must flee their homeland!

Each individual tree is in remembrance of people for whom the escape route across the Krimmler Tauern Pass in 1947 had a fateful significance, as well as to all the brave volunteers who rendered outstanding services to the reactivation of this escape route and to the social and refugee assistance of Alpine Peace Crossing.

The two natural stones found in this grove – the stone of peace "Windbachfall" and the stone of flight "Krimmler Kees" – stand as a Mensa, a symbol of hospitality for refugees. They are dedicated to great individuals who were themselves refugees or protectors of refugees or have made a name for themselves as founders of peace. All the names of the dedicated individuals can be found on our website.

The growth of the trees and the pathway through the grove stand as a living reminder of these people.
